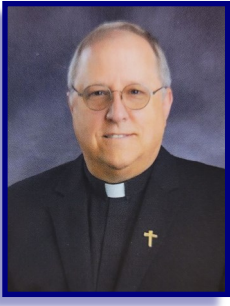

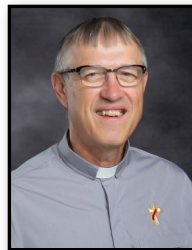

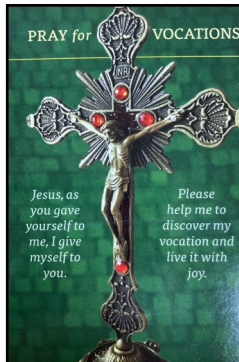


## **Thoughts from Deacon Bill**
