— CNCAP had a client that they were helping with rent and this client had just lost their job and they were super sad and just really

down on themselves. One of the CNCAP employees gave the client a body wash set from the giving tree. That client was happy and thankful.

—A married couple needed help with their electric bill because last month the husband couldn't afford his medication as he doesn't have health insurance. He ended up in the emergency room and lost a week of work. After looking at the budget, St. Leo's paid their electric bill and also referred the husband to an insurance agent that has helped people get affordable healthcare.

—A client was living in Hope Harbor and was accepted into income based housing. This client only receives disability so when she needed rent and deposit, it would have been hard to come up with both. St. Leo's paid for the deposit for her and she is now living on her own.


—A client had lost their job and was without a job for 2 weeks. She is a single mom and had 2 children at home. She was able to get another job but was unable to pay her full rent, since she was off for 2 weeks. She had to wait another 2 weeks for her first paycheck from her new job. The client had \$300 go towards her rent. St. Leo's partnered with the Salvation Army to pay the remaining rent so she can stay housed.
