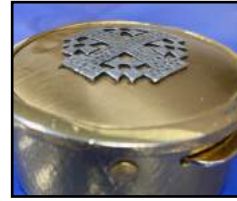

What is Outreach and how does it work?

Outreach has been at St. Leo's for more than 21 years. We are the only parish in our diocese that has an outreach program. Since it was created, 5% of the tithes and offerings goes into the outreach fund. With this funding, we are able to help those in the community who are struggling to stay in their homes or struggling in general. Some examples are rent, utilities, application fees and misc. Most of the time we are the last resort to an individual. I work with many other agencies in the community to help fill in the gap especially to those who do not qualify for other programs in the area. The main goal is that after I help the individual with their need, they will be able to sustain the next month without any help.

Other ways we use outreach funds is throughout the year to serve the community with our Catholic social teachings — for example, flowers for the homebound, the coat giveaway and many other projects throughout the year.

Human Concerns is a committee through the outreach program. With this committee we meet once a month to talk about ways we can better serve our community and ways we can make activities throughout the year better.



ST. BASIL, JAN. 2, AND ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON, JAN. 4

ST. BASIL, Bishop of Caesarea, was likely born in 329 and died on Jan. 1, 379. He ranks after Athanasius as a defender of the Oriental Church against the heresies of the fourth century, especially Arianism, which denies the divine nature of Jesus Christ. He was a strong supporter of the Nicene Creed. With his friend Gregory of Nazianzus and his brother Gregory of Nyssa, he is part of the trio known as "The Three Cappadocians," of which he was the most important in practical genius and theological writings.



ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON was the foundress and first superior of the Sisters of Charity in the United States. She was born to Episcopalian parents into New York City high society on Aug. 28, 1774. She was married on Jan. 25, 1794, in St. Paul's Episcopalian Church to William Seton. When his father died, they took over custody of his seven half brothers and sisters as well as the family's business. He died of tuberculosis in 1803. Elizabeth fasted and prayed and was received into the Catholic church on March 14, 1805. Her conversion unleashed a storm among her Protestant relatives and friends. In January 1806, her younger sister-in-law became ill and begged to see her and to become Catholic. Threats were made to have Mrs. Seton expelled from the state. Cecilia fled to Elizabeth for refuge and was received into the Church. They moved to Baltimore and purchased a farm. Mrs. Seton was elected superior of a modified version of the Sisters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul in 1813. She died in Emmitsburg, Md., on Jan. 4, 1821.

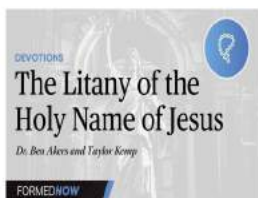
