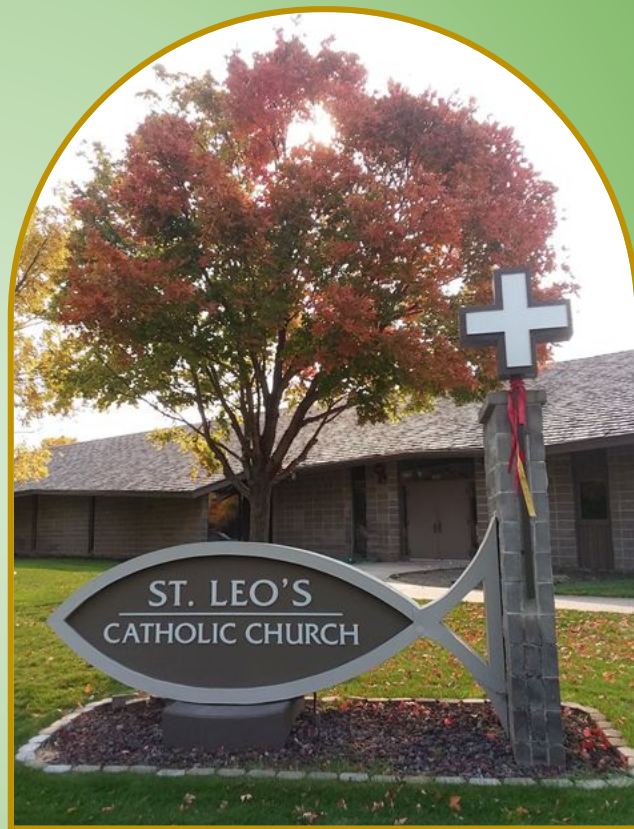

Gospel Mk 10:17-30
