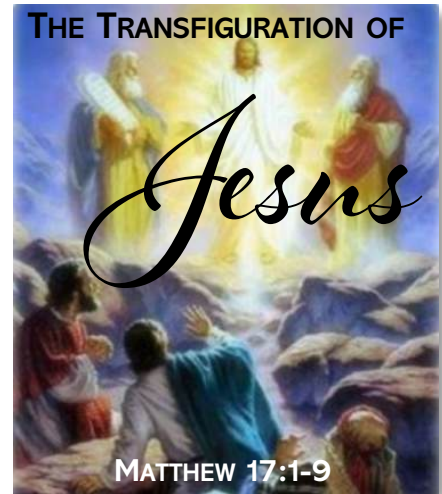

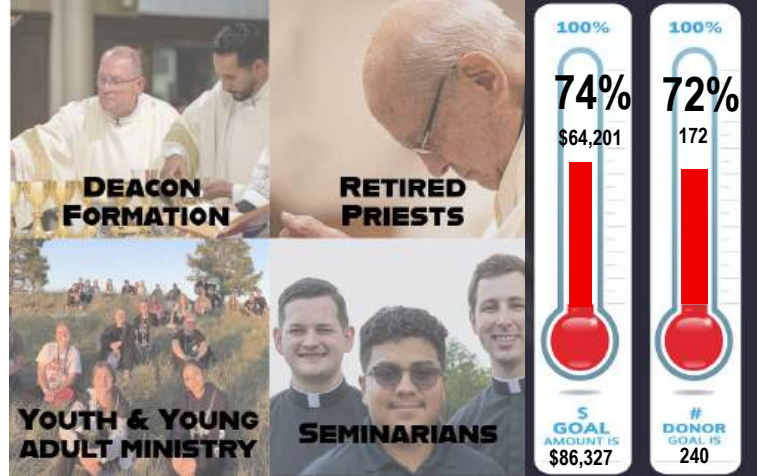

## Testimonies of Praise

**CADE AND CINDY** have been staying with family for the last 2 years. They have 3 children who are currently in foster care however they are very close to reuniting. In order for the children to come home, they need to have their own place with the right amount of bedrooms for the children. Cade and Cindy are both working and they are working with a case manager through DHHS that is helping them with budgeting. They are so excited. They have saved money for the deposit but will need help with the first month's rent. St. Leo's worked with other agencies and paid a portion of their first month's rent. Another agency is working on furniture and beds for the children.

**JOHN AND KIM** have been homeless for the last 3 months with their 3 emotional support dogs. They stayed at Hope Harbor or they would stay in their van. John is on SSI and Kim is disabled and waiting for approval for SSDI. They found affordable housing especially with their limited income. They had the deposit but needed help with first month rent. This rental was a blessing as the landlord was ok with their 3 dogs. St. Leo's helped with the first month rent.

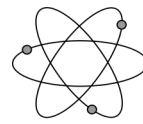

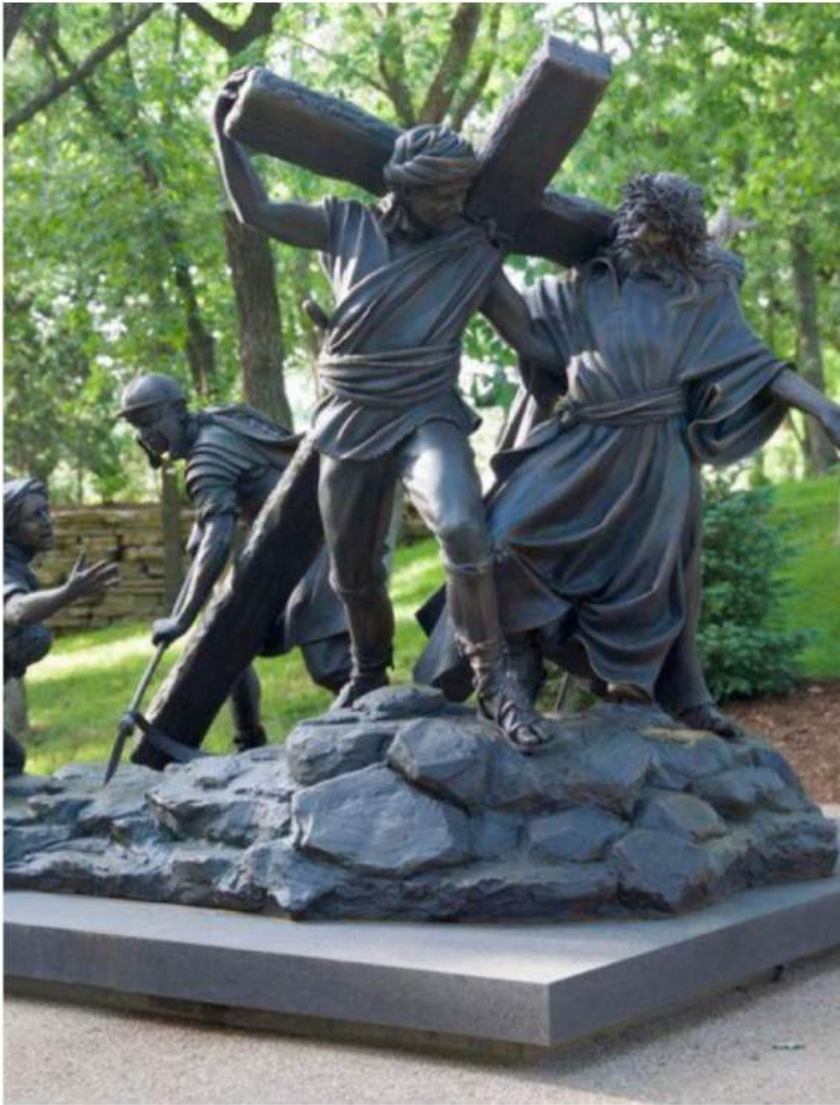
