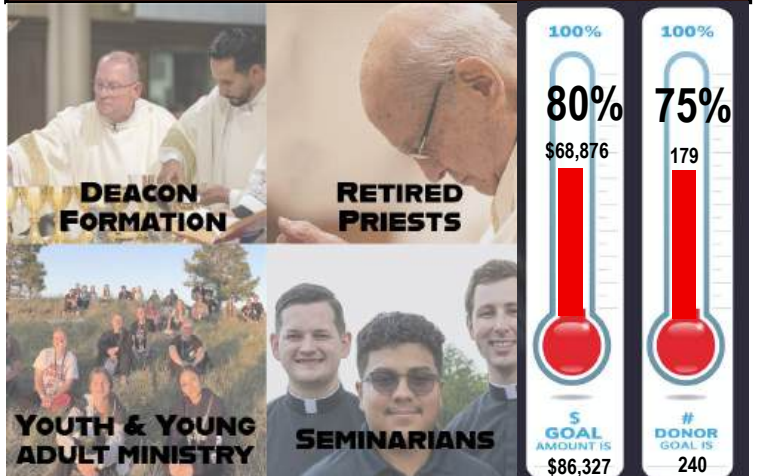

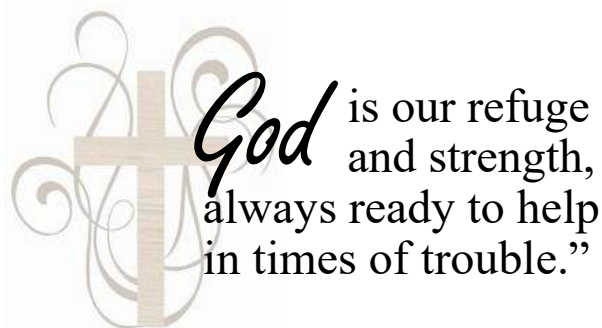

Testimonies of Praise

CARLY came to us because her utilities were shut off. She works full time. She recently split up with her abusive and controlling husband. He would always pay the bills and would never allow her to budget or see what’s in their bank account. When looking at Carly’s budget, she has a lot going on. She had to borrow from her 401K in order to get a new place and said that she has no idea how to budget. I spent more time with her to really dig into her budget and we made a plan for her next pay check. She will be able to support herself in the future but really needs guidance on budgeting. St. Leo’s paid her utilities to get them turned back on. I have another appointment with Carly in two weeks to set up her budget for the next pay period.

JOHN needed help with his utility bills. John’s wife just had a baby and they also have 3 other children at home. He is working at JBS, however, he took off 3 weeks to be with his wife and children during this time. He had a little bit of PTO but not enough to pay the bills that need to be paid. They also had to buy necessary items for their baby. We completed his budget and he definitely will be able to support them in the future. St. Leo’s helped with his bill.



ASHLEY is a single mother to two children. She is also a veteran. She and her children became sick a month ago and were off work for 1 1/2 weeks which set her back financially. Also, one of her daughters needed dental surgery and she had to pay for the entire amount and has been making payments on that as well. Then her rent increased \$150 more. Ashley has so much going on and was super stressed. She works a full-time job and part-time job. After completing her budget, she will be able to support herself in the future. She just had so much happen at the same time financially. St. Leo’s helped with her utility bill.
