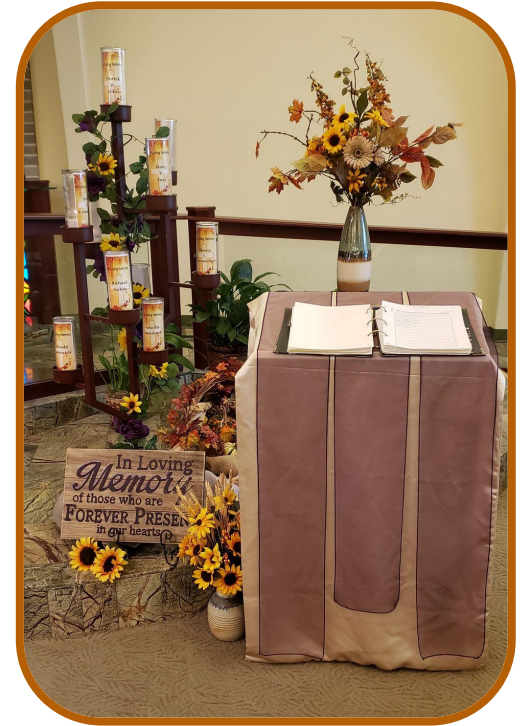

Homily


